

Recipe of the Week

Six Stuffed Green Peppers

Brown 1 pound lean ground beef in 1 tbs. cooking oil. Add 1 can tomato paste and 1 can water. Season with 1/8 tsp. garlic salt, 1/4 tsp. Italian seasoning, 1 tbs. minced onion, and salt and pepper to tase. Simmer for 1 hour.

Boil 3/4 cup rice until tender in 1 1/2 c water and 3/4 tsp salt. Drain (if necessary) and add to sauce. Fill 6 parboiled peppers.

Sauce for topping:

1 tbs. butter, 1 can tomato sauce, and 1 can water. Heat to boiling stage. Spoon topping sauce over peppers and sprinkle 1 tsp. grated Parmesan cheese over each pepper. Bake in 325F for 40 minutes.
