Poppies

For almost a century, The American Legion Auxiliary Poppy Program has provided a way for all Americans to honor and assist past and present members of the military. The poppy was adopted as a symbol of freedom and blood sacrificed by troops in wartimes after a teacher read the poem "In Flanders Field".

The poppies are handmade by veterans and some auxiliary members. ONE HUNDRED PERCENT of all monies collected is used to assist veterans or active-duty military personnel and their families when financial and/or medical needs are evident.

Members of the Post 221 Auxiliary, which meets here, plan to use money collected on Sunday, May 26th, to help a veteran with travel and training expenses incurred when receiving a free service dog, provide welcome household baskets for veterans entering transitional housing and/or purchase items for the Charlotte USO.

Recipe

South African Chakalaka

3 tbsp oil
1 onion finely chopped
2 cloves garlic crushed
1.76 oz ginger finely grated
2 tbsp mild curry powder
1 red pepper finely chopped
1 yellow pepper finely chopped
5 large carrots (unpeeled but scrubbed and topped and tailed) grated
2 tbsp tomato purée
14.11 oz can chopped tomatoes
2 sprigs fresh thyme leaves
14.11 oz can baked beans
Salt and pepper to taste.
Heat oil over medium heat.
Add onion. Cook until soft

and translucent.

Add curry powder, ginger, garlic and stir.

Add diced pepper and grated carrots. Give it a good stir.

Combine tomato paste and fresh tomatoes. Then add to pot.

Simmer five to ten minutes. The mixture has to be thoroughly mixed and somewhat thickened.

Add fresh thyme and beans. Keep at a low boil for 5 minutes. Turn off the stove. Serve either warm or cold.

Raptor Security System

We have a new visitor management system known as Raptor. If you have school-aged children, you are more than likely familiar with this system. Used by more than 5,300 (40%) U.S. school districts, this technology has become a quick and easy way to assist staff in recognizing who should or should not be on campus, in a building, or around children.

When coming to the campus Monday – Friday, 9 – 3:30 pm, you will use the main office doors and let the staff know you are here. If you are to enter the preschool building anytime during preschool hours, Monday – Friday, 9 – 1pm, you must have a badge issued to you by the main office or the preschool office and conspicuously wear it. If you are on the cooking team or any other group that accesses the big kitchen, you must come to the church office, check-in, and wear your printed badge. Please, do not enter any side door to bypass this check-in. If you are not entering the preschool building but on campus, please check-in at the main office; you do not have to have a printed badge.

This system does require a driver's license or state issued I.D. card. You will present your I.D. during your first check-in. Your image, name, and date of birth are collected from the scanner. A search is completed on publicly found offender databases. The Raptor system does not collect social security numbers. All data is contained in-house. This system will not be used on weekends or in the evenings.

This system is in place on our campus for everyone's safety - especially to protect the preschool's children. This visitor management system will allow the church staff, preschool staff and teachers to know if someone is on the campus, and if they should or should not be in certain areas. Thank you for your support and faith in allowing the two staffs to work together creating a safer environment for all who work here and attend school here.

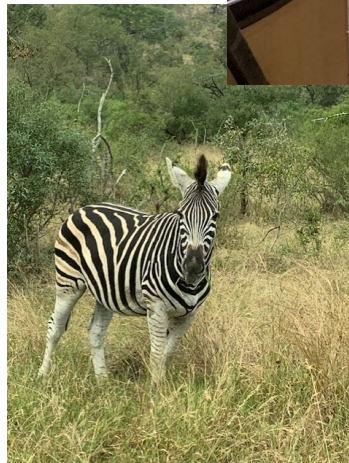

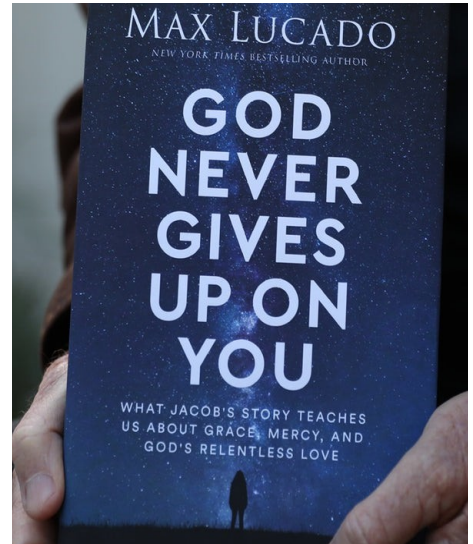

Stepping Stones

Foster families take on a large responsibility when caring for children who have been removed from their familiar surroundings and put into a stranger's home. This transition is stressful for all involved. More than 50% of foster families quit after the first year or first placement. It has been found that with a support group, 80% continue as foster families. We will become a support group.

Fostering the Family (FTF) works with Department of Social Services for South Carolina to find families in the area who would like support. FTF then connects the family with a care community near them.

Other churches in this area also work with FTF as care communities. Lake Wylie Christian Assembly works with FTF to prepare future foster families so that they understand what fostering entails. Stepping Stones (SS) of Steele Creek Presbyterian Church at Pleasant Hill will work with FTF to be a support group, aka care community, for one family.

The volunteers of this group will commit to serving up to 24 months with encouragement and prayer, meals, celebrations, family experiences, bi-monthly supplemental groceries, house and yard work, etc.

Next week we will visit the sub-teams of SS-SCPCPH.
