

#### **Fellowship Opportunities**

You have the opportunity to join a new fellowship group! On the first Friday of each month, starting in June, the church will sponsor a variety of activities like traveling to a restaurant for lunch, going to local area attractions, and occasionally taking a day trip, all while enjoying your church family. This opportunity is open to everyone in the church.

On June 7th at noon, we will meet at Captain Steve's Family Seafood Restaurant in Fort Mill, S.C. You can drive yourself or come to the church at 10:30 am to carpool. You will need to be at the restaurant no later than 11:15 am so you can be seated with our group.

On our second field trip, July 5th, we will visit the Billy Graham Library. Other fun trips, some out of town, are being planned, so stay tuned!

### 10 Cents a Meal on Sunday

Ten Cents A Meal Sunday. If you are unfamiliar with "ten cents a meal Sunday", the last Sunday of every month, the children race around the sanctuary collecting money to support people without the finances to have three regular meals per day. Can you afford 10¢ per meal per month? This comes, on average, to \$9 per month per person. Do you have loose change? Every little bit helps.



Welcome to Stepping Stones, a ministry to meet, lift up, and wrap arms around foster families wherever they are in their journey.

The Stepping Stones ministry is a subgroup of the Missions Ministry team, and will be led by Sandi Lauerman and Mamie Gaver. Stepping Stones is creating a care community for one family that is fostering child(ren), and Stepping Stones is inviting you on the journey.

So, what is a care community? A care community will be a group of up to 8 people that will support a fostering family with prayer, mentorship, generosity, knowledge, and all the fruits of the Spirit.

The groups that surround a family and makeup one care community are as follows: a team leader, a family helper, a child mentor, and an interim caregiver. The latter we are not currently pursuing; that becomes an overnight role from one to 14 nights after trust is built between the family and the care community. We are looking for our volunteers to serve in the roles of a family helper or a child mentor.

The family helper will serve in ways that will help support the fostering family. You may supply a monthly meal, a gift card to a restaurant, help with grocery shopping, assistance with laundry and/or errands, help with yard work, or even help with homework for biological, adopted, or foster children in the household. We know how everyone loves algebra!

Not everyone is in the position to foster, but being a child mentor in our care community allows you to have a positive influence on a foster child. The role of child mentor can allow you to be more involved in the life of a vulnerable child, and it gives you the opportunity to pour love and encouragement into them. Continued next page
