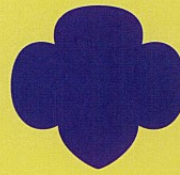

Kairos prison ministry says thank you for the donation of cookies. There were enough cookies not only for the inmates but also for the guards as well. A big thank you for our church's generosity.

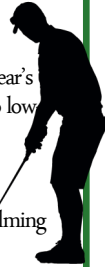

The adult Sunday school class is meeting at 9:30 am in the choir room until August 25. Pastor Dexter Greene is teaching the Gospel of Mark.

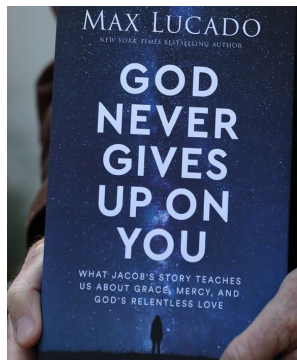
SUMMER CRAFTS
