Advent Devotional

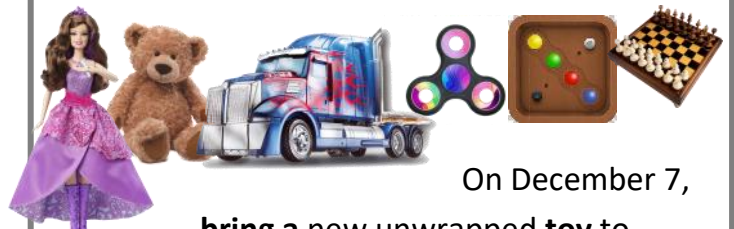


We are trying something a little different with our Advent devotionals for 2025. This year the booklets were not purchased. Select members of staff and community

Shoebox recipients can join The Greatest Journey, a 12-lesson discipleship program with a workbook that helps them understand Jesus Christ, His power, and His special love for us all. Upon "graduation" from this program, each child is presented with a New Testament that includes additional

Biblical information. This is often the first copy of God's Word that they will own. These children share the Gospel with their families and friends, thus spreading the message and multiplying our Christian message!
