Ben Brown Applicant Essays

In March the students who applied for a Ben Brown Scholarship were tasked with writing an essay for you. They were informed in advance that the essays would be published. The students were to compose a 1-page essay with the writing prompt: ***Reflecting on your journey within our church family, how has your faith shaped your academic interests and career goals? Please describe how you plan to use your education as a ministry in the marketplace, honoring God by making a meaningful difference in your chosen field.***

My interest in finance originates from my faith as a Christian as well as the relationships with other Christians (the Church). My financial interest began with the parable of the talents and the three servants who were willing to do more for their master. The first servant made five talents, the second made two talents, and the third hid him away. The servants who gained more silver also took more risks. I found it fascinating that the way someone can grow their wealth by being willing to risk what they care about is very similar to how someone should grow their relationship with God by risking what they have to serve Him. This interest was further developed by my Economics teacher in high school who recommended multiple financial books to me that were written by Christians that taught how to grow and use your wealth to serve the Kingdom of God. My career goals have also been shaped by my time as a Christian. The main goal I have for my future career goals is to use my job and role as a Christian to grow the Kingdom of God and help the church. I hope to use my eventual financial knowledge as a way to bring people closer to God in multiple ways. One way I want to help bring people closer to God is by being a good example of a Christian. when you are willing to help someone through financial struggle and you are willing to give time and be there for them you show yourself as a good example of a Christian. Secondly I think that a good way for me to bring people to God is by telling them the story about what brought me closer: the parable of the talents. By tying my career path with a biblical story I can help to bring people closer to

God by giving different insights and by showing them that the way to grow financially is very much similar to growing closer to God. I think a major way I hope to honor God is by being a good example of a financial expert. Oftentimes the financial sector is seen as greedy and dominated by self interest. I want to be the opposite of how many see the financial sector by being giving, willing to help others, and showing God's love. I don't want to only focus on how to make money, maximize profits, or maximize returns, I want to use my financial knowledge to help grow the Kingdom of God.

These along with 5 other pans of Meatloaf, Chicken Pot Pie, Ham-burger Noodle Casserole and Chicken Noodle Casserole were delivered to Defend the Fatherless by a team who spent a morning sorting clothes.

Sandi, Becky, Jean, Mamie, Judy and Donna organized clothes from the multiple bags of donations by age and size. As always, it was a real pleasure to be with the team at Defend and see the amazing organization that goes into to providing wraparound care and support for the foster and kinship families in the area.

Palisades High School

A big thank you to everyone who has contributed to the graduation gifts for 12 homeless seniors at Palisades High School. Six boys and six girls are dealing with challenging situations, including living in hotels or hostels, sharing rooms with multiple siblings at a friend’s house, or sleeping on sofas. Three of these students are designated as unaccompanied, meaning they have no adult guardian.

We are assembling graduation packs for them that include toiletry gift bags donated by members of the congregation, practical items, and gift cards. You can still donate if you would like – either by putting your gift in an envelope marked “Palisades High School” and leaving it in the offering plate, or by donating online through Giving in Church Center and selecting the “Palisades High School” fund.

We will keep you updated on any other ways you can support these students. Thank you for your continued interest and care for these vulnerable young people.

It has been another busy week for Missions as we gathered together on Saturday to pack over 15,000 meals for Rise Against Hunger.

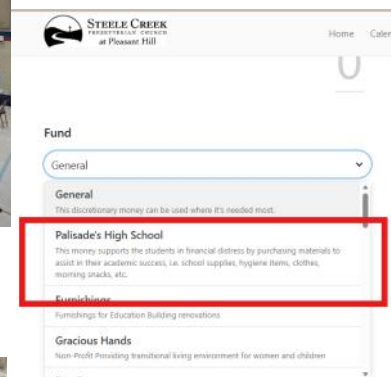
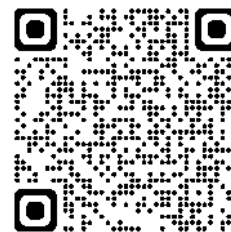
Over 100 volunteers of all ages arrived and donned their orange hair nets to begin a smooth operation where dry rice, dried vegetables, soy and vitamins were funneled into a bag before being carefully weighed, heat sealed and packed in a box. There was a job for everyone – the youngest to the oldest and as well as providing much needed, nutritious food for many vulnerable school children in Africa, we also had an enormous amount of fun.

This has been the 24th year of supporting Rise against Hunger and in that time almost 300,000 meals have been provided by the generosity of Steele Creek and Pleasant Hill. As you can see from the photos – there were a lot of smiles so if you missed out this year, plan on being there in 2027!

Also, we celebrated on Sunday with your Youth Group who did an amazing job throughout the worship service, and we were privileged to support and celebrate with Tatum Haston on her graduation from High School – well done Tatum, see page 5 for more on Tatum. We also remembered our college students with the Ben Brown Scholarship and now we have the opportunity to remember 12 senior students from Palisades High School who hope to graduate this summer. All of them are homeless – some

living in hotels, some sleeping on sofas at friends houses, some living in cramped conditions as they wait for homes of their own. We plan on providing 12 graduation gift packs to each one, and if you would like to support this ministry you can donate through Church Center Giving- Palisades High School, or put a donation on the offering plate on Sunday with a note saying it is for Palisades. And thank you for continuing to have a heart for these young people.

Thank you for calling the church office to make us aware when someone is in the hospital. We are certain that person and the family appreciates the visitation and prayers.

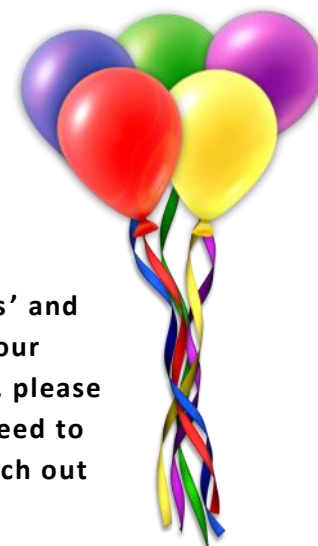
